The high lights of the new Silas release are:

Processing:

- Headers can now be included in several contact export formats
- Contact detection manual can now be opened from the Help menu when a contact detection license is active
- Improved borehole display when borehole logs exit the seismic display
- Improved and simplified import of *.bor borehole log files
- Bug fix: Solved access violation when exporting Innomar SEG Y
- Bug fix: No more pop-up messages every minute if license is about to expire
- Bug fix: Calibration distance can be adjusted again in cumulative density wizard
- Several minor bugs fixed

Acquisition:

- Logging can now be automatically stopped and restarted if a specified file size is reached
- Start/end can now be set to significantly higher values and the interaction with the maximum display depth has been improved
- Bug fix: Removed display lag
- Several small bug fixes and user interface simplifications



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The software should always be run with administrator rights. If there are still problems starting the software while running it as administrator, it might be due to active firewalls blocking the Silas software.
